Dear Parents/Carers,

Happy New Year and welcome back to pre-school! We hope that you all had a lovely Christmas and are looking forward to a busy Spring Term. What a strange start we have had with yet another closure this week due to the adverse weather conditions. We apologise for any inconvenience caused and hope you all enjoyed a safe and warm day, filled with fun.

I would like to take this opportunity to extend an enormous thank you to my team, who have worked so hard over the Christmas break in order for us to be ready to accept younger pupils on our first day back. The pre-school has been carefully rearranged and resources updated to ensure that we can provide excellent care, lots of learning experiences and plenty of fun to all pupils 18 months to 4+ years old. There is of course always work to do, but with the inclusion of traditional resources such as dolls houses, high quality puzzles, lots of new sensory toys, carefully selected reading books, art/craft activities and outdoor equipment, we are a setting where imagination and creativity is nurtured and I am confident and excited to watch Stockland and Yarcombe Pre-school go from strength to strength in the future.

Over the next few weeks, we are learning through play about winter; what the weather is – what happens and why, what we need to wear in winter and different species of winter animals. We will look at the concept of freezing and melting, as well as thinking about our coats to learn about different materials and why they are used to make things, using our senses to explore and describe them! Our older pupils will be participating in slightly longer Phonics and Number sessions daily, to build confidence and fluency in these key skills. We would encourage you to practice rapid recognition of sets 1 and 2 speed sounds (m, a, s, d, t, i, n, p, g and o), as well numbers 1 – 10, to support with this. In the coming weeks we will also upload the Rolling Programme for the next two years, including detailed overviews for each half term.

Swiggle is a search engine designed to provide a safer environment for kids taking their first steps on the road to safe online searching. Powered by Google Custom Search, the results are filtered using Google SafeSearch and educational resources prioritised. - We are outside a lot and sometimes we get rather messy at preschool when using resources such as paint and water as part of our learning. Please can you ensure that your child/ren have plenty of warm, spare clothes in their bags as the weather gets even wetter and muddier, so that we can keep them clean and warm!

STEM activity: Waterproof material investigation!

STEM stands for science, technology, engineering and math. STEM can refer to the subjects individually or one or more working together, but can also mean a way of doing things that includes solving problems, asking questions, and exploring the world around us. In EYFS, STEM generally fall under the specific area of learning known as 'Understanding the World'. This is all about getting children to engage in the world around them. The goal is to help them understand the big ideas and concepts that most adults take for granted.

Today's science investigation is a fun one! We're going to waterproof a boot – not a real one, as hopefully your boots are already quite waterproof, but a paper one! The idea is to print off the sheet, colour it in, cover it with different materials and then spray it with water to find out which materials are the most waterproof!

Welly Walk Wednesday & PE with Mr Murnane

On our nature walk we will keep an eye out for footprints in the mud. Wearing our wellies, we will have a go at making our own footprints as we squelch and squash. We will use sticks to make our own marks in the mud. Back in the classroom we will use paint to create our own footprints and animal prints.


Thinking Thursday

Fresh Air Friday

We will be making story sticks to retell the story of our own 'Squirrel Hunt'!

This activity uses a stick to record a journey and tell the story of where the children have been and what they found along the way. This will support the children to learn structure writing with a beginning, middle, and end, as well as using time words and openers in story writing.
