As we come to the end of another exciting and busy term at Stockland and Yarcombe Pre-School, we want to take a moment to celebrate the wonderful achievements of our children. Some of our key highlights include:

- Spring Nature Walks The children enjoyed exploring the outdoors, observing signs of spring, and collecting natural materials for our craft projects.
- Gardening Thanks to the support of our committee and parents, and the hard work of staff and the children too! our garden is really beginning to take shape.
- Baking and Sensory Play Through hands-on experiences like baking and water play, the children have been developing important early skills in mathematics, fine motor control, and teamwork.

- Physical Development Thanks to Mr. Dan Murnane's support, our focus on physical activities has helped enhance balance, coordination, and overall well-being.

A key focus this term has been encouraging independence. We have been supporting the children in putting on their coats, tidying up after activities, and making choices throughout the day. These small steps are building confidence and preparing them for their next stage of learning. We encourage parents to continue fostering independence at home by allowing children to practice simple tasks such as dressing themselves, helping set the table, and making small decisions.

We would like to extend a huge thank you to all our families for your ongoing support. 
