Reading

If you drop just one soda can out the window, it's no big deal...right? But what if everybody did that? At-Home Activities to Boost Name, Letter & Number Recognition

• Name Puzzle

Write your child's name on cardboard and cut it into large puzzle pieces. Let them put the puzzle together to learn letter order.

• Name Tracing

Use washable markers or finger paint for your child to trace their name on paper, a window, or even a tray of shaving foam!

- Alphabet Treasure Hunt Hide magnetic letters or letter cards around the room. Call out a letter or sound and have your child find it.
- Letter Playdough Mats

Make or print letter outlines and let your child form the letters with playdough.

• Number Hopscotch

Create a simple hopscotch grid with numbers 1–10 using chalk outside or tape inside. Call out numbers and jump to them.

• Counting with Everyday Objects

Count snacks, toys, or steps together. Encourage your child to say the numbers aloud.

- Letter and Number Songs
 Sing catchy songs like "The Alphabet Song" or "Five Little Ducks" to reinforce recognition.
- **Name Recognition in Books** Point out your child's name in storybooks or on labels around the house.
- Sticker Letters and Numbers
 Give your child sheets of letter and number stickers to place on paper to form their name or number sequences.
- **Matching Games** Use cards with letters and numbers to play simple matching or memory games.

• Sun Safety Reminder

As the warm weather continues and temperatures get even hotter, please remember the absolute necessity of sending your child to school with a **hat**, **suncream applied before arrival and provided for top-ups** and **light**, **loose-fitting clothing that covers their shoulders**. To date, we have tried not to phone parents when these items haven't been provided, instead keeping children in the shade to protect them. However, we would really appreciate your support in ensuring your child comes prepared so they can safely enjoy outdoor activities. Thank you for helping us keep everyone safe and comfortable!
